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School Background

Nalanda Bal Sr. Sec School was started in 1985 with affiliation from Haryana board affiliation. Mrs. Yashpal Kaur and Mr. Virender Singh are the founding members of the committee who initiated this endeavor to provide good quality education to rural children in 'Dayalpur' village with minimal financial resources and infrastructure. However with consistent efforts and support of community, the school has now grown to offer more than two acres of premises with all required facilities for students and staff. In 2017, the school got privileged to attain CBSE affiliation.

Since then, around 1450 students have passed out from school. Around 100 students from the school have got admission to Jawahar Nehru Vidhyalaya since 1987. Many alumni got selected in JNU, DU and other top universities for higher education. Several alumni of the school are placed in highly prestigious jobs taking lead in several spheres in society like IT, Medical, Education, Business, Indian armed forces etc. Some alumni have also got professional opportunities to work abroad having got settled there.
